A BIT MORE ABOUT US

The RSPCA in York, Harrogate and District is a separately registered charity, although we are supported by and work in partnership with the RSPCA National Society. We are primarily self-funded and the money we spend at the Home is raised in York, Harrogate and surrounding areas. Income is also generated by our charity shops in Goodramgate, York, Acomb and Selby.

The RSPCA has been helping animals and their owners in York since 1864. The first "Home for Lost Dogs" opened on St George's Field in 1944. It had very few facilities and was replaced in 1956 by the building on Castle Mills Bridge where the boat office is today. It became the "Home for Stray and Unwanted Animals" when a cattery was added in 1957. Regular flooding and a lack of facilities and staff accommodation meant that it was necessary to fundraise for a new home, and our current premises opened in 1980.

The York Animal Home is licensed to look after 30 dogs, 24 cats and 10 rabbits, as well as many small furries and birds. Our small wildlife unit houses hedgehogs and feral birds which are released back to the wild when they have been brought back to health. Maintenance of the 9 buildings, staffing costs, supporting our volunteers, veterinary bills and most importantly caring for, rehabilitating and rehoming our animals costs around £1,400 per day. Ensuring that we are efficient and use our hard-earned funds in the most effective way possible is the responsibility of the Board of Trustees and our management team.

There is always a waiting list of animals that have been abandoned or neglected waiting for a rescue place.

Heath came to the centre as a stray with a horrific eye injury, after being found collapsed on a grass verge by a member of the public.

After seeing the vet, it was determined that unfortunately his eye could not be saved due to the severity of the injury. Poor Heath was in a lot of pain and it was clear he had been suffering for a while, as the wound was not a fresh one. He immediately underwent emergency surgery to remove the eye.


Heath recovered extremely well from his surgery and soon became the sweetest cat we could wish for. However, vet bills for his treatment and impending dental costs were stacking up, so we decided to run a fundraising appeal to help cover these bills.

On Facebook and Instagram, we managed to raise a huge £1,526.30! It turned out that Heath had a number of cracked, broken and rotten teeth so this funding was essential.

We are pleased to report that Heath has now found his forever home. He is a real inspiration; despite all the neglect he has been through, he is still willing to forgive and trust people again. This is why we do what we do, and fundraising for the RSPCA York, Harrogate & District Branch will make sure animals like Heath stand the best possible chance of happiness.

FUNDRAISING IDEAS - GET INSPIRED!





- 10k In a Day Perfect for those who want to complete their run in one day. Just pick a day that works for you and run a 10k route in one go.
- Mar-Woof-On Complete a full 26 mile marathon either in one go or across a 30 day period. It's up to you!
- The Big Woof! Challenge yourself to walk or run 100 miles in 30 days.
- The Full Yorkshire Can you complete a full circuit of Yorkshire in just 30 days. This 450 mile challenge is designed for those who are super active and one to give themselves a real challenge.

Two of our youngest fundraisers raised an amazing £1,580 by taking part in a lockdown sleepout in 2020! They slept in a tent in their garden for 50 consecutive nights, through rain, wind and sunshine.





One of our superstar volunteers discovered a way for our Branch to make money by selling aluminium drinks cans to a local scrap metal business! Volunteers have been raising hundreds of pounds every month and this is a fantastic example of a successful community fundraising initiative.

#CANCELOUTCRUELTY

Warning Some readers may find this page distressing

Animals are regularly brought to us via our RSPCA inspectors after being subject to terrible conditions and cruelty. Money raised by supporters like you can make all the difference to their recovery, often saving their lives.

Seven years ago, RSPCA inspectors seized 14 Irish setters from a breeder. These poor dogs were subjected to a life of misery;



forced to live in squalor whilst their owners lived comfortably and carefree. The setters were split between our York Animal Home and another RSPCA branch. As you can see from these photos, we were devastated by their condition and worked tirelessly to improve their health and mental wellbeing.

A year later, after months and months of adjourned court cases, the people who left these beautiful boys to live in horrendous conditions finally had their day in court. They were sentenced to 26 weeks in prison and a lifetime ban. This sentence was welcome but it will never make up for the trauma that these dogs experienced.

All cruelty cases are despicable but this was a particularly memorable one for our animal care staff. Thankfully, our Irish setters were all rehomed to wonderful new owners and are now out in the world living their best lives.

KEEPING SAFE & LEGAL

When fundraising for the RSPCA York, Harrogate & District Branch, it is important that all participants are safe and money is handled carefully. Please take some time to read through the below information and apply relevant guidance to your fundraising activity or event.

- 1. Please display our registered charity number when executing your fundraising activity: 232222
- 2. As an independent supporter (as opposed to an employee or paid fundraiser for the RSPCA York, Harrogate & District Branch), please note that you should refer to your fundraising as being 'in aid of' (and not 'on behalf of') the RSPCA York, Harrogate & District Branch. This means you do not represent the charity.
- 3. In law, you will be a trustee of any funds raised and must ensure that all donations and sponsorship money from your event is paid to the RSPCA York, Harrogate & District Branch. You must inform potential donors if any amount or percentage of the funds you raise will not be paid to the charity.
- 4. You may need to carry out a health & safety risk assessment for your event and to ensure that all participants are fully briefed and adequately supervised. Depending on the nature of your event, you may need insurance to cover your liabilities.
- 5. You understand that if you do something that threatens or damages the name or reputation of the RSPCA York, Harrogate & District Branch, we will ask you to stop fundraising immediately.
- 6. You may need a licence for your activity or event e.g. a licence from the local authority to collect funds on the street, in a public place or by going from house to house; a licence under the Gambling Act for a raffle or lottery; or a licence for the sale of alcohol / entertainment.
- 7. Depending on the nature of the activities at your event, you may need to account to HMRC in respect of VAT or income tax.
- 8. If you are collecting personal information from donors, remember that there are requirements under the Data Protection Act 1998 relating to how you deal with that information.
- 9. Please encourage eligible donors/sponsors to make gift aid declarations. This will make the most of your fundraising efforts by enabling us to recover basic rate tax on their donations.
- 10. You may only use fundraising materials that you have a right to copy and use.
- 11. We would love to see photos from your fundraising activities so that we can share them and inspire others. Please email <u>fundraising@rspca-yorkhome.org.uk</u>, message us on social media or share a post in our 'Friends of RSPCA York Animals Home' Facebook group.
- 12. If you are under 18, your parent/guardian takes responsibility for you under these T&C (which you have shown them), please also ensure they are happy about what you've chosen to do.

If you are unsure about any aspect of your fundraising idea and you would like to talk things through with us, please do not hesitate to get in touch. Most importantly, have fun and feel amazing about what you are doing to help so many animals in need. Thank you!
